What is the purpose of the program?

The Certificate Program in Practice-Based Research Methods seeks to develop a new generation of independent investigators within the practice-based research network (PBRN) community. It provides training in concepts, skills, and methods for conducting practice-based research and building PBRNs.

Who is leading it?

The program is being offered by the 8 AHRQ-funded Centers of Excellence in Practice-Based Research and Learning.

Who can participate?

The program is designed for individuals who aspire to become independent PBRN research investigators and for experienced investigators who want to develop expertise in PBRNs.

How much time will it take?

The time commitment is modest. Fellows will devote approximately 4-6 hours/month to learning activities during the ten-month program, which will run from September 2016 to July 2017. Each fellow will have a local mentor who devotes 1-2 hours/month.

How is the program structured?

There are four primary learning methods:

1) Active mentoring by a PBRN leader; 2) Participation in live webinar-based training and discussion seminars taught by PBRN experts; 3) Development and presentation of a research concept paper for a PBRN study; and 4) Development and presentation of a Specific Aims section. The program will culminate at a Convocation held prior to the NAPCRG National PBRN Conference in Bethesda, MD during the summer of 2017.

What are the benefits of participating?

You will receive training and mentoring from top PBRN investigators and build skills that accelerate your development as a research investigator. You will also meet and interact with key leaders in the PBRN field.

What is the cost?

There is no cost to participate. The program does not provide financial support or require PBRNs or P30 Centers to do so.
