Sources

- Factual claims, direct quotations and paraphrases, and intellectual conclusions of others are cited in MLA format at the end of the video
- Images are labeled as free to use and the web addresses from which they were downloaded are listed at the end of the video
- Sources are credible and relevant
- Sources are varied (if appropriate)
- Number of sources is enough to provide direct support of and enhance the argument but leaves space for your own voice and intellectual conclusions

Main Argument/Narrative Structure

- Main argument is central to the narrative structure
- Main argument is contestable and original
- Main argument unfolds logically
- Narrative arc is clearly organized
- Main argument is directly supported by convincing evidence

Form

- Use of multimedia is effective: video entertains and engages its intended audience through a mixture of visual images, sounds, and alphabetic texts as appropriate for the specific project
- Quality of video is high: images are not blurry, sound is clear, alphabetic text is readable
- Transitions between shots are smooth and visually appealing

Collaboration
