










Nubian civilization, Sphinx of Taharqo, Sudan, circa 680 BCE. Granite.




Nubian civilization, Statue of Amun in the form of a ram protecting King Taharqa, Sudan, circa 683 BCE. Granite.



Nubian civilization, Shrine, Sudan, 100 CE. Sandstone.


Nubian civilization, Naqa, Temple of Apedemak (The Lion Temple, front & rear), Sudan, 100 CE. Granite.






Nubian civilization, Faras, Bird Frieze from the Cathedral of Faras, Egypt, 7<sup>th</sup> century, CE. Sandstone.

Map of Aksum








