John Canoe: Same as above, plus name of early 18<sup>th</sup>-century slaver trader on Africa's Gold Coast


John Coonah: Southern U.S. term for Christmas masquerade

gens inconnu: French for "masked people"


jeunes cannuers: French for "young cane cutters"

dzonko nu: Ewe term for "male sorcerer"









Map of the Southeast United States, Gulf of Mexico, & the Caribbean. Gold-Coast SLAVES FOR SALE.
