Imagine Durham 2100 envisions a future built off of the UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals, which include protecting life on land and in water, reaching zero hunger, increasing affordable housing, and having gender equity. This community-based, collaborative project will bring together **young adults** in building skills and literacy on environmental science, while also **giving voice to youth ideas and concerns** about the futures they'll inhabit. This is an innovative professional and academic preparation program, wherein learners will co-design, build, and create their own resilience and sustainability action plans, then have an opportunity to continue to **collaborate with the Museum** and our partners on developing sustainability programs.
