

2025 Duke University Faith, Holiness, and Human Flourishing_Workshop

Given increased interest in the topic of "Human Flourishing" (a state of happiness/wellbeing, meaning and purpose, virtue/morality, close social relationships, mental/physical health, & financial/material stability) and the narrow pathway that leads to it, we will be holding a full-day online workshop on Faith, Holiness, and Human Flourishing.
