



“Moral Injury” (MI) is the internal emotional distress experienced as a result of transgressing moral values, observing others doing so, or being a victim of MI (guilt, shame, spiritual struggles). This topic initially received attention in active-duty military and veterans following combat operations, but now has expanded to include first responders, healthcare professionals, and others exposed to morally injurious experiences (MIEs). We will be holding a **full-day online workshop on Moral Injury via Zoom** on **Saturday, July 11, 2026**, with the focus of updating what is known on the topic with its recent inclusion as a Z code in the DSM.
