Court Case Schedule – Manage public: courtrooms, hallways, general areas





By order of the Sheriff, effective Monday, April 6, 2020, there will be mandatory temperature screenings for all staff and visitors entering into the Durham County Judicial Building. In addition to temperature screenings, face coverings must be worn in all public areas in the courthouse at all times.

If within the past 14 days you or anyone living in your household has had any of the following:

- Fever above 100.4
- Cough
- Shortness of Breath
- Close contact with anyone who is under observation or has tested positive for COVID-19

Do not enter this facility.

PUBLIC HEALTH: On The Front Lines

- February/March: contacted King County Sheriff's Office (Seattle, WA) <u>Best Practices</u>
- Civilians/1st Responders (deputies & detention officers): equipped w <u>PPEs</u>
- Service Calls: triage protocol, social distancing, patrol cars & all equipment sanitized
- Durham County Detention Center: keeping COVID-19 out of congregant facility
- Detention Officer(s) testing positive
- Inmate testing, no positive cases, new protocols in place regarding detainee population
- Inmate Population Reduction: March (stay-at home-order): 362 vs. 260 current (-28.17%)


