

Application Deadlines, Salaries & Stipends, and Administrative Flexibilities

Application Deadlines

- The community is being updated about late application and deadline extensions via notice for select FOAs.
- Late application policy notices are listed on the <u>Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19)</u>: <u>Information for NIH Applicants and Recipients of NIH Funding</u> website.

Salaries & Stipends

- If unable to work on grant or training activities, salaries and stipends may be charged to NIH grants.
- Ensure that your organization's policy allows such charges from federal and non-federal funds.
- Prior approval is not required to divert faculty from research to clinical work related to COVID-19 until the end of the public health emergency period.

Application Deadlines, Salaries & Stipends and Administrative Flexibilities (continued)

- Administrative Flexibilities
 - OMB has authorized agencies to utilize administrative flexibilities to recipients conducting COVID-19 research and recipients affected by COVID-19
 - NIH is allowing:
 - Pre-award costs to be incurred
 - Extensions of post-award reporting
 - Prior approval requirement waivers
 - Numerous flexibilities regarding expenditures of funds

Accommodations for Loss of Research Time

- Extensions for early stage investigator eligibility due to COVID-19-related disruptions will be considered
- NIH will be flexible with extending time constraints for fellowship, career development, and training awards, including phased awards

Personal Reflections

- Be/Think Positive: NIH has a broad mission
 - Addressing a public health emergency is just one aspect of NIH's mission
 - Learn about which NIH IC is most appropriate for your science
- You might feel like you are the only one
 - Many are in a similar situation
 - This is one of many chapters in your career trajectory
- Be honest with yourself and others about your COVID-19 challenges (research, clinical, and personal)
 - Realign expectations (yours and others) if necessary
 - Needs and asks might be different now
- Honor You
 - You are well trained and have marketable skills
 - Be true to your passion: Shall I pivot toward COVID19?
 - Do things to cultivate mental and physical resilience
 - Don't forget that many people care





Be Strategic

- Find the people who are willing to help
 - Work with your mentors (e.g., developing revised timelines, look funding sources)
 - Find ways to extend your network (e.g., National Research Mentoring Network, Great Minds in STEM, professional societies)
 - Talk to people who might help implement your short-term goals (e.g., protecting some of your time from clinical and/or teaching activities)
 - Contact NIH Program Staff, as needed
- Opportunities
 - Learn more about NIH (e.g., study some FOAs, watch open sessions of IC's Councils)
 - Perhaps learn new skills (e.g., quantitative data skills, online teaching)
 - Work on a back-burner manuscript
