
EKG Lead Placement



Limb Leads	Limb leads should be equal distance from heart and in about same place on each
	limb
	Clinical tip: Apply electrodes on legs with lead connections pointing towards the
	head to allow best connection to lead wire.
V_1	Fourth intercostal space at the right border of the sternum
V_2	Fourth intercostal space at the left border of the sternum
V_3	Halfway between V ₂ and V ₄
V_4	Fifth intercostal space at the left midclavicular line
V_5	In the horizontal plane of V ₄ at the anterior axillary line (or halfway between V ₄ and
	V ₆ if the anterior axillary line is ambiguous)
V ₆	In the horizontal plane of V ₄ at the midaxillary line

To find the correct intercostal space:

Palpate point at which sternum attaches to clavicle (the suprasternal notch)

Then palpate down to identify sternal angle, which is the bony prominence at which the second rib attaches to the sternum

The space below second rib is second intercostal space

Continue to palpate down the patient's sternum, counting the ribs and intercostal spaces to find the appropriate location for chest electrodes.
