William T. Anderson retired from the Department of Defense in 2005 after over 35 years of service. From 1987 to 2005, he served as a senior legal advisor at the Supreme Headquarters Allied Powers Europe, the operational military headquarters for the North Atlantic Treaty Organization. He attended Hampden-Sydney College in Virginia and later received a B.A. degree in Economics from American University. He holds a law degree from Washington and Lee University and a M.A. degree in political science from Georgetown University with a special emphasis on security studies. He was commissioned in the Marine Corps in 1969 and served as a judge advocate in both the 1<sup>st</sup> Marine Division and the 1<sup>st</sup> Marine Aircraft Wing at the conclusion of the Vietnam War. In 1980, Mr. Anderson became a civilian international attorney in the Department of the Navy in Washington, DC, until he was seconded by the Dept. of Defense to the NATO assignment. He retired as a Colonel, US Marine Corps Reserve, in 1999 following duty as Deputy Chief of Staff, Headquarters, Marine Corps Forces, Europe, from 1993 to 1998. From 2009 to 2017, he served on the adjunct faculty, College of Distance Education and Training (Command and Staff College Program), Marine Corps University at Quantico, VA.
