

**Short Biography – Alexandra H. Perina** (February 2021)

Alexandra Perina is the Assistant Legal Adviser for Nonproliferation and Arms Control at the U.S. Department of State, leading the office that provides legal advice on the negotiation, interpretation, and implementation of arms control and nonproliferation agreements and arrangements, nonproliferation-related sanctions and assistance projects, and civil nuclear cooperation, among other programs. She has served as an attorney in a variety of positions at the State Department for fifteen years, previously leading the Department's legal offices for political-military affairs and for employment law, and has advised on issues ranging from the law of war and use of force, cyber, counterterrorism and intelligence matters, to environmental and maritime law, to personnel law and employment litigation. From 2013-2014, she was an International Affairs Fellow in residence at the Council on Foreign Relations. Prior to joining the State Department, she worked as a litigator at Debevoise & Plimpton LLP in New York and as an associate at Human Rights Watch. Ms. Perina received a B.A. from Haverford College and a law degree from New York University School of Law.
