## **CAPT Trevor Grant, USN**

CAPT Trevor Grant is currently serving as Fleet Judge Advocate at U.S. Pacific Fleet. Pacific Fleet is the world's largest fleet command, encompassing 100 million square miles, nearly half the Earth's surface, from Antarctica to the Arctic Circle and the West Coast of the United States to the Indian Ocean. The fleet consists of approximately 200 ships, 1500 aircraft, and 150,000 military and civilian personnel.

CAPT Grant is a native of Charlottesville, Virginia. He commissioned through the United States Naval Academy as a Surface Warfare Officer. He served on board the guided missile destroyer USS ROSS (DDG 71) and the aircraft carrier USS RONALD REAGAN (CVN 76).

CAPT Grant's overseas assignments include Naval Forces Europe/Naval Forces Africa/U.S. SIXTH Fleet in Naples, Italy, and a Special Operations Task Force in Mazar-e-Sharif, Afghanistan.

He has also had multiple leadership positions within Navy Legal Service Command.
