1.	First, take 2-3 minutes to review your notes. Fill in blanks or add ideas you did not have time to write down while in class.
2.	Turn to a neighbor and compare notes. Practice some of the following: • Ask questions and clarify areas where your notes differ.
	 Identify gaps - key ideas or supporting details that you did not record but you neighbor did.
	 Correct errors or misunderstandings. Perhaps identify what you want to bring to office hours.
	Which ideas are most important?

• Is there a narrative or argument coming through?
