PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The EBP Fellowship is a 12-month, mentorship program where nurses and allied healthcare professionals develop a project using EBP methods from project development through implementation.

Categories of projects should fall into one of the following categories:

- Quality nurse-sensitive indicators (i.e. CLABSI, CAUTI)
- Falls
- Well-being/Resiliency
- Workplace Violence/Incivility

PROGRAM PURPOSE:

Impact clinical practice change by implementing evidence-based projects in a 12-month mentorship program using EBP steps:

- Identify the problem
- Search for the best available evidence
- Critically appraise the evidence
- Integrate the evidence with clinical expertise and patient/family preferences and values
- Evaluate the outcomes
- Disseminate the findings

Stimulate innovative thinking that can improve patient and family outcomes

Foster professional growth and development

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

- At least 1-year of employment at DUHS
- Employed at 0.60 FTE or more
- Interest in learning about EBP
- While not required, consideration will be given for those who have completed an EBP workshop such as the Duke Mitigating the Madness
- Manager approval
